Conservatory Metropolitan District Community Update May 1, 2011

As part of its ongoing effort to keep residents apprised of current matters before the Board of Directors of the Conservatory Metropolitan District, the Board intends to provide periodic updates to the community. The information contained here is only a brief summary, and residents are encouraged to attend Board meetings to learn about matters firsthand. The Board meets regularly at 9:00 a.m. on the third Monday of each month at the Conservatory Clubhouse, 2665 S. Jebel Way. Minutes of recent meetings are posted to the District's website. Spring Landscaping Projects: The District has replaced 69 trees along Hampden, Jericho and Conservatory Parkway. Some additional ornamental trees in planting beds in the greenbelt areas also will be replaced this year. The District's Board of Directors is planning to replace the dead and declining trees in phases, as budgetary constraints allow, over the next few years.

<u>Flower Planting:</u> It's that time of year again! The flower beds throughout the community will soon be planted with a mix of annual and perennial flowers. Last year the flower beds were planted with one-third annual flowers and two-thirds perennial flowers. The same mix will be used this year to continue with the plan of reducing the area to be planted with annual flowers and increasing the number of flowers that will bloom year after year.

<u>Doggie Pot Stations:</u> There are seventeen pet waste disposal stations throughout the community. The District goes to great lengths to monitor and provide the appropriate level of service while minimizing the cost to our taxpayers. There is a recurring problem at many of the stations with the receptacles being used for trash. This causes the receptacles to reach capacity prematurely. Please use the receptacles for their intended use to ensure that they are available when needed.

News You Can Use: Summit Services, the District's landscaping services provider has made us aware that the Zimmerman Pine Moth has been spotted in the area. The following information is excerpted from an article by W.S. Cranshaw appearing in "Trees & Shrubs". Larvae of the moth damage trees by tunneling under the bark, making gouging wounds. Most injuries occur at branch crotches. Pale yellow, popcorn-like masses of sap occur at the wounds. Preventive insecticide sprays applied to the trunk before the caterpillars begin tunneling, are best applied in late April or early May.
